
Requested Zoom-In Round Table Discussions

There are **Five Types** of Discussion Topics

- 1) Context: Where the Whole is greater than the sum of its Parts.
- 2) Concepts: Relationships are more important than Details.
- 3) Physical Systems: That influence response.
- **4) Societal Systems:** That influence Perspectives that result from Experience.
- 5) Emotions: That result from Feelings (PTSD: Military vs. Civilian vs. Student)
